

Short Communications

Short communications should be limited to not more than 2,000 words. It begins with a title, an abstract of not more than 100 words, followed by the main text and references, and may include two figures/tables. Unlike a full length paper, 'Methods, Results and Discussion' may be combined in a short communication.

Short communications may include research notes covering new findings, annotated checklists, recent inventories as well as field observations, or descriptions of a new record, a newly discovered species, a specialized habitat or an ecosystem either of special conservation interest, immediate conservation attention or local and/or regional significance from a tropical forestry perspective. Short communications are not intended to publish preliminary results of an ongoing or recently concluded study unless the results are of exceptional interest and particular relevance to tropical forestry.
